## Strong results at Tritton

Our geology team continues to deliver strong drilling results, with recent work at the Avoca Tank and Budgerygar underground mines showing encouraging signs of high-grade copper close to existing areas.

Four underground drill rigs are working to extend known deposits and identify new opportunities nearby. Highlights include:

- Avoca Tank appearing larger than previously understood
- Budgerygar showing increased thickness at depth

These results point to more high-grade copper underground, supporting ongoing operations and keeping Tritton performing strongly.

Exploration remains a key focus, with drilling set to continue into FY27 as we build on this momentum.

They reflected on Tritton's beginnings 20 years ago, its growth to multiple operating mines, and what the future holds with new projects and ongoing exploration.

Senior guests shared their own memories of how mining has shaped the region over time, supporting local jobs, growth and opportunity.

There was something special in sharing these stories with the next generation who will help shape the future, and we were honoured to be part of it.



## Preserving cultural significance at Constellation

Working together to carefully preserve a scar tree of cultural importance ahead of construction.

Ahead of construction at our Constellation site, our environmental team recently completed an important piece of Cultural Heritage salvage work, focused on protecting and preserving items of cultural significance before ground is broken.

A key part of this work was the careful relocation of an Aboriginal scar tree. The distinctive oval scar on its trunk suggests it may have been used to create a coolamon - a traditional wooden vessel used to carry food and water. Scar trees like this provide a meaningful connection to cultural practices and hold deep historical value.

Due to its fragile, partially free-hanging condition, the removal required a thoughtful, hands-on approach. More than ten team members from across the operation paused their regular work to help, working alongside Registered Aboriginal Parties and archaeologists to ensure the process was carried out with care and respect.

No machinery was used; instead, the team relied on shovels, improvised supports and close coordination to safely recover and transport the tree without causing further damage. The scar tree has now been safely stored and preserved, ensuring its cultural significance is protected for the future.

This work highlights strong collaboration with cultural heritage specialists and a shared commitment to protecting the land's history, something the crew can be proud of.

# Constellation Project moves forward

**We have been focusing on optimising mine design and preparing for construction.**

The Constellation deposit is progressing from planning into construction, following several years of careful work and collaboration since its discovery in 2020. Open cut mining is currently planned to begin in the new financial year.

We were pleased to welcome members of the Girilambone community to a Constellation project update on 20 April. Paul Harris and Construction Manager Roy Sharma shared the latest developments and answered questions.

Early works are underway, with crews carrying out important early activities to prepare the site. These include survey work and setting up controls to manage erosion, sediment and traffic.

In the coming weeks, activity on site will increase. This will include construction of a 29km water pipeline and data cable connecting Murrawombie to Constellation, upgrades to Okeh Road, establishment of environmental safeguards, and building a laydown area where major mining equipment will be assembled.

Local contractor Neill Earthmoving has been awarded the haul road works and is already bringing people on board, with crews and subcontractors from Nyngan and Dubbo contributing to the project. Roy Sharma said the project brings together teams from across Aeris and represents an exciting milestone. He highlighted the importance of safety and teamwork as construction ramps up.

The Constellation Project is expected to support local jobs, strengthen the region's future opportunities, and deliver long-term benefits for the community.



## Murrawombie Pit



Work at the Murrawombie Pit has moved into the next stage, providing more ore to the Tritton plant. This means the mill can now run at full capacity. Rehabilitation is also progressing as planned, with materials from the pit being used to safely cover and restore older areas of the site.



# Building a stronger future for Tritton

## Aeris expands its portfolio to support long-term operations at Tritton

---

Aeris Resources is taking an important step forward with the planned acquisition of Peel Mining, expected to be finalised in July. This will bring the Mallee Bull and Wirlong deposits into the Aeris portfolio - both located within trucking distance of Tritton and a natural fit for our existing operations.

Together with our current mines and the upcoming Constellation project, these deposits will help maintain a steady pipeline of copper into the future, supporting ongoing operations in the region.

Mallee Bull is already well progressed, with early planning and approvals underway, while Wirlong is at an earlier stage but shows strong promise. As these projects develop, they will help strengthen the long-term outlook for Tritton.

Importantly, this is not just about growth -it's about stability and sustainability. A longer-life operation helps support local jobs, strengthens the regional economy and provides greater certainty for the communities connected to Tritton.

## Community Consultative Committee

The Community Consultative Committee (CCC) discuss a range of issues including operations updates, environmental matters, community engagement, the Constellation Project and Murrawombie Open Cut Operations.

This group and its members act as a conduit for understanding and addressing community issues relating to Tritton and its operations.
